

Pottenger was touched, and a the Greek gesticulated and talked, the secretary made up his mind to do all in his power to assist a worthy cause and bring two loving hearts together.

Calling up the tool company, he learned that the Greek was one of its valued employees, that he had property in excess of \$5,000 and that his position at good wages was secure.

The next move was to wire United States Senator Shortridge, stating the case, and asking that some way be found to re-unite the lovng couple.

These telegrams started the grea governmental machinery, and seventy-two hours later both Pottenger and all who had learned of the incident, were delighted when the secretary received a wire from Washington that if Monzakis yould forward \$125 to cover necessary expenses, his future bride would be placed on a west-bound train with a ticket for Torrance.
