"The third activity, that of pro-viding more homes, has taken a great deal of time and thought, for as a result of a questionaire sent out to ascertain about how many homes would be required, and at what prices, and on what terms, it developed that about 300 houses would be needed which could be sold for from three to four thous-and dollars and on terms of about 10% cash and 1% per month, fn view of the tremendous activity in the building line in all cities in Southern California, and the furth-er fact that 25% is considered a standard for a first payment on a home, the board of directors was up against a tough proposition. No less than 20 big contractors and building companies were interview-ed and our requirements laid be-fore them, but in almost every in-stance we were turned down with-out a personal visit on their part being made to our city. "Four of these builders, however, came to Torrance and spent consid-erable time looking over the situa-tion, and then decided to invest their money elsewhere. The Board of Directors then decided that a loc:1 Mutual Building & Loan As-sociation might be the solution, so after several conferences, with var-ious Building & Loan Association executives, the TORRANCE MU-TUAL BUILING & LOAN ASSOCIA-TION was organized and is now in operation. The Security Housing Corporation of Los Angeles which finances the purchase or building of a home up to 70% of its value was also induced to start opera-tions here. 
