Nation Said to be Short Plastered Walls Should be Studied for Best **Situation Acute**

Why go to an achitect for your plans when there are organizations who will make plans and build for you all in one contract?
For several reasous. Some of the organizations I speak of will tell you that they employ architects as a part of their staff, and this is true; but it is also true that no architect can serve the interests of the owner to best advantage when drawing his pay from the contractor

It is for the interest of the owner to have a good quality of materials specified throughout. The contractor who employs an architect can save money by having him specify materials of a lesser cost.

Often to the uninitiated the two qualities look exactly alike.

It is only in the short life of the poorer quality that the difference will be revealed when in use.

Doubtless there are in such organizations architects who are conscientious and who would like honestly to do well by those whom they serve, but such hold their positions not by choice, but through force of circumstances and must do what those over them prescribe.

Above them constantly hovers their over-lord, the head of the organization, whose orders they must obey. It is he who prescribes how much work shall be done on the plans and how the specifications shall be written.

Three never was a successful organization of the kind I speak of, both making plans and doing building, that did not have connected with it one or more able salemen.

These salesmen have to be paid and who do you suppose pays them?

Why those who build, of course—indirectly, but none the less surely.

What would you think of a physician or lawyer who went around peddling his wares, telling what fine service he rendeerd?

Most architects with a taste for their art do not relish that kind of salesmanship and hence are not often found soliciting business and are indifferently successful at it when they do.

These combined planning and building organizations, however, have no such compunctions, but thave solicitors at work constantly drumming up trade.

These latter become expert at "talk" finally accumulating a goodly line of it.

Coordinating with the Better Homes Week, thousands of model homes, in as many cities, were thrown open to public inspection Monday morning, to remain open until October 14, and many will remain open for an indefinite period after that.

Millions of prospective home builders will visit these model houses to gain inspiration afresh for a new and better home.

The result will be a veritable epidemic of constructive effort to kindle the desire for new homes and to actuate that desire into a country wide era of building.

The architect, on the contrary, has only the owner's interests to consider when preparing the plans and specifications, and the actual construction is put out to competition, where the lowest responsible contractor gets the job.

By reason of such competition this method often saves the owner many times the architect's fee.

One favorite talking point of the organization salesmen is that by their method much of the cost of plans is eliminated.

Let us analyze that point right here. It is in the completness of plans and specifications that the owner's wants are portrayed with definitness, with sureness, without guesswork and future adjustment.

Competent draftsmen are necessary to prepare such graphic documents accurately and satisfactorylly, so as to fully show forth the owner's wants.

The cost of such draftsmanship is a part of the cost of a building, whether you patronize an architect or a building company it is so.

The building companies, however, often reckon drafting expense as a part of the cost upon which their commission is computed. Hence, the more they pay their draftsmen the larger their commis-

It is a well-known fact that for this very reason draftsmen are frequently able to draw higher salaries from such organiztions than they are from architects.
