Calcimine Walls Are Economical

Calcinine is a water paint or water color. It is generally known as "tint." The base is whiting, clay,

etc.
The color is mixed with the base

is added.

When the dry material is mixed with water the binder readily dis-

The evaporation of the water after the application leaves the calcimine firmly on the surface of the wall the wall.
Calcimine is the most economical

way to finish a wall. It is easy to recoat at a very small expense. It is also much easier to apply than

paint.

However, calcimine has a tendency to chip or fall from the surface. Although it may be the cheapest way to color walls it is by no means the best.

means the best.

The material may be obtained in most any color desired.

Prepared wall size may be purchased for this work. Gelatine glue dissolved in water is often recommended

nended. A pound of good flake glue dis-solved in a gallon of water will

solved in a s......

answer.

This may be done by heating the water and adding the glue or by letting the water and glue set over night. The size must not be applied

letting the water and glue set over night. The size must not be applied heavy.

Ordinarily five pounds of calcimine mixed with one gallon of water will give good results.

However, it must be remembered that there are many kinds of water colors or calcimine. Low priced material may require eight pounds of color to a gallon of water.

Buy the best and use less.

The material should be mixed heavy at first. That is, add about half the water and beat up the paste to remove all the lumps.

Now add the balance of the water gradually and continue to stir until all the water is mixed in. One pound of calcimine will cover about seventy-five square feet. In other words, a mixture of five pounds of color and a gallon of water will cover 375 square feet or a room 8x10 feet 9 feet high, ceiling and walls.
