How to Get Your **New Auto License**

The following instructions are issued by the division of motor vehicles to owners of motor vehicles in making application for 1923 registration.

See to it now that you have a 1922 certificate of registration. If you have not, apply to the department for a duplicate.

If you have changed your address, forward your certificate to the department with the change of address noted thereon for correctance.

tion.

If your certificate is illegible, send it to the department and you will receive a new one.

If there is a legal owner on the certificate whose claim has been satisfied, it will be necessary to have the legal owner sign as same on the back of the certificate to release his claim.

If a second-hand motor vehicle has been purchaged, have a transfer made in the department at once and secure a certificate in your name.

If you have changed or altered the style of your vehicle to a different type, get a dismantling form from the sheriff, police or other peace official: and—mail it to the department with your certificate, and a new certificate will be issued.

Non-resident owners whose permit to operate in this state has expired, must apply at once for a California license.

All of this can be attended to at the branch offices in San Francisco, Oakland, Fresno, Los 'Angeles, or San Diego, or at the Sacramento office.

All persons who operate a motor vehicle must have an operator's license in their possession.
