The Atlantic and Pacific oceans to be connected by a "double track" system of ocean-to-ocean water routes—a "one-way" traffic

That is coming, according to business experts, because the steadily growing commerce of the world will, within a few years, demand construction of the Nicaragua canal, which, paralleling the Panama canal, even at some distance, will eventually work out that way.

Even though President Harding is said to have abandoned his recent plan to begin work on the Nicaraguan project, it is believed such abandonment is only temporary, as the demands of growing commerce, it was pointed out, cannot be turned aside—not even on account of tremendous costs—for commerce must be and always has been served.

Last year the Panama canal earned \$3,466,574,09 net, with this year's net promising to double that amount, so the Panama canal commission said. But its net transit expenses were \$7,919,017.63 in 1922. It cost \$380,000,000 to build.

The commission indicated that within the next 20 years when the Panama waterway reaches its capacity, its net earnings will be startling.

The approximate cost of the Nicaragua project will be \$1,000,000,000 based on present costs, Secretary of War Weeds recently told the President.
