policeman who pushed women of the way of a driverless automobile which coasted down Hill street was well praised for his act by eye-witnesses. He deserved praise. When the public sees an official perform his duty with distinction, praise is seldom withheld.

But the public is not in a position to see all the praiseworthy acts of the men who are in the public employment. A case in point may be seen in Torrance.

At the city's sewage disposal plant the septic tank has been clogging to such an extent that for the past year it has been evident that the tank whould have to have a thorough cleaning. This tank is about the size of a small bungalow and could not be pumped out. Men had to go down into the filth and stench with buckets to remove the tons of gas-filled liquids and solids.

Not a nice subject to read about is it? But what about the feelings of the city employes whose unpleasant duty it was to labor for two weeks at such an offensive task?

The health of the city was men-

iced by the inability of the sewer plant to properly care for the waste matter of the city. Few persons outside the city engineer's office were aware of the growing menace, however. To the men who watch the welfare of the city and who go about daily performing the unromantic care of the city, their duty was clear.

These city employes, with neither music playing nor banners fly-ing, faced their disagreeable task in the same spirit as soldiers who go into a dangerous action. Under the guidance of J. J. Jessup, city engineer, eight men put on hip-boots and slickers, and for half month labored faithfully to put the sewerage system in a normal condition ta protect the health of the people of Torrance.

The danger to their own health, their natural revulsion to such work, and with no thought of reward, these men have grimly la-bored until their task is completed. It is such men as those who are heroes of modern life. Unlike the heroes who perform some spectacular feat, the men who serve humanity quietly, though bravely and at the sacrifice of their own health and happiness, receive few words of praise, and still fewer gold medals.




