Fifty Acre Lease In South Lomita Immediate Drilling

Signal Hill and Huntington Beach Co. Will Start Drilling Above Sand Pit First of Next July

Lomita again jumped into the lime-light this week when the Hollingsworth Company leased fifty acres in the south part of town to Wigle & McBride, an oil company of 41 American avenue, Long Beach. This company is now operating extensively in the Signal Hill district and at Huntington Beach. Forming of this lease has been under way for several weeks and covers the acreage bounded by a line almost directly above the reservoir of Water Company No. 5, extending south to the Palos Verdes Estates, thence west and north to the Weston Ranch and east back to the reservoir.

This is a part of the Lomita was sold, and was selected by the oil company to be the most desirable section for prospect wells. The first well will be drilled just above the Sidebotham sand pit. If sufficient showing of oil is found there will be ten more wells put down in rotation, the extent of drilling operations to be governed only by results from test wells.

When seen yesterday C. B. Holingsworth said there was no bonus or rental consideration stipuated in the lease, but that his company insisted upon imemdiate action, this being the paramount condition of the lease. "If there is oil in these hills we want it right now. Bonuses and rents don't count if we get an oil well. Acceptance of rent only tends to delay the game. Both myself and associates as well as Wigle & McBride feel confident that a great oil field awaits the drill."


