Such written consents, signed by the owners or their authorized agents, must be filed with the building inspector before a permit according to the official map thereshall be issued for the erection or location of any building or structure nearer to the street than hereinbefore specified.

The provisions of this section shall not effect in any manner the validity of Ordinance No. _____, or any other ordinance providing for the establishment of set-back line by the Board of Trustees, unprocedure involving notice and hearing.

In this Ordinance the set-back line refers to the building line of the house and porches open throughout this entire width will be permitted to extend to within fourteen feet of the front street line or six feet of the side street

In Business District, Class III in fire district No. 2 buildings of Class C or D may be constructed provided the provisions of Section 14 hereof as to set-back lines be complied with, but said provisions as to set-back lines shall not apply to buildings or Class A. B. in said Business District Class III.

DEFINING THE WORDS "LOT" AND "PROPERTY"

Section 17. The word "lot" as used in this Ordinance shall mean a single parcel of land as described in the deed of the owner. In any proceeding for changing a district, a lot or parcel of land may be described by specifying the ex terior boundaries thereof, or by giving the lot and block numbers of on file in the office of the county recorder, or by any other method which will clearly indicate the property intended to be changed. The word "Property" as herein used shall be deemed mean real property or lands, toany improvements

Section 18. Public buildings may be located wherever the Board of Trustees shall determine ADDITIONAL BUILDINGS ON SAME LOT

Section 19. In District No. not more than two single family residence buildings shall be built on an inside lot, and such build-ings shall not be nearer in any part that 20 feet from any other building on the same lot used for dwelling purposes. Any structure, whether independent of or attached to, a building shall, for the pur-pose of this Ordinance, be deemed a building or part of a building. ENFORCEMENT PENALTIES

Section 20. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300) or by imprisonment in the city prison for a period of not more than six (6) months, or by both fine and imprisonment. Each such person, firm or corporation be deemed guilty of a separate offense for each and every day during any portion of which any violation of any provision of this Ordinance is committed, con tinued or permitted by such person, firm or corporation, and shall

be punishable accordingly.
