Offer One Issue of Magazine to Torrance For \$1000

A delegation from the Hermos Beach Chamber of Commerce, consisting of the secretary and two directors, attended the directors

sisting of the secretary and two directors, attended the directors' meeting here last Tuesday and presented their plan for the grand' carnival to be held next month at Hermosa. They asked for a queen candidate from Torrance to represent this city at the carnival. Afteronsideration it was decided to take no action in the matter due to the fact that in a very short time the local American Legion will probably have several queen contestant in the field for the 1923 Fiesta to be held here in July or August. magazine and distribute 10,000 copies.


