OIL IN GARDENA AT JULIAN WELL

Julian struck oil last Friday at the Pico well two miles east of Gardena, in the Gardena road district, and at a depth of somewhere near 2000 feet. The oil strike was preceded by a heavy gas pressure which painted the derick for a distance of thirty feet with a deep gray coating of the dissolved shale formation which spouted up as one of the first indications of the near approach to oil and on June 1st the oil was found.

It is credited to high authority that the well could be turned in now at an output of 200 to 300 barrels. But Julian is after big game and is sending the drill down below the 2400 foot level at a rate of fifty feet every twenty-four hours, running night and day.

A visit to the well discloses every indication of oil for it is floating on the surface as pumps bring up the water of dark gray shale color as it floats to the sump near the derrick. Any amateur can see that it is oil and no one around the premises cares to keep the matter a secret. Julian is after oil and sees nothing that should be concealed from the public.

The great speed that is being made, in comparison with some other drilling operations, is a surety that but a short time will elapse before the deeper oil sands shall be struck with a heavy flow and the flag will soon be unfurled from the top of the derrick proclaiming "0il at the Julian Pico well in the Garden oil Fields."
