Streams in Southern California will be stocked this year with 1,135,000 trout from the Mt. Whitney hatcheries alone, according to the report received by a personal representative of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, who has just returned from the station.

Varieties will be distributed in the following ratios:
Steelhead trout, 1,920,000.
Rainbow trout, 730,000.
Loch Leven trout, 305,000.
Eastern brook trout, 180,000.
Urging fishermen to come up to the high lakes region, extending between Lone Pine and above Mammoth, the officials in charge of fish distribution for this section report finest catches of gamey fish. The larger number planted this year exceeds by a million the trout planted last season.
