# **ON PRODUCTION IN TORRANCE** AND LOMITA FIELD THIS WEEK

Ten new producers were brought in during the past week in the Torrance-Lomita field. Nine hundred barrels a day was the flush production obtained by the 5-0 Drilling company at Palm and Pennsylvania streets, where its new well was completed Moore No. 4 at 3775 feet for 1000 barrels flush pro-duction. This well is opposite the Petroleum Securities Marble lease. Beaver State's No. 1 on Acacia street near Narboune is producing about 360 barrels a day, having been completed at 3780 feet. Land and Wall brought in their No. 4 well on Pine street for 800 barrels a day, from the 3785 feet level.
