SPOTLIGHTS ON SPORT

HANK DE BERRY, who last season became the first string backstop of the Brooklyn club, has sent in his contract, signed, to Owner Ebbets from Savannah, Tenn., where he lives, and with it was a letter informing his boss that he is eager to start getting himself into condition for another campaign. DeBerry also wrote that he deserted the bachelor ranks not long ago and will take his bride to the training camp.

Last season DeBerry was a very active member of the Robins' catching department and handled the deliveries of the pitchers intelligently. As Dazzy Vance's battery mate Hank was at his best and he caught the fast shoots sent up by the blond righthander with rare skill. DeBerry, before joining the Robins, caught Vance while the two were members of the New Orleans Pelicans, and the battery was one of the most powerful in the Southern league.

DeBerry's first complete season in the big show was marred by an accident before the team went west for the third and last time. In a game against the Giants at Ebbets field, and with Vance pitching, a foul tip off Frank Frisch's bat split DeBerry's right thumb, and as a result of the painful injury he was laid up for the remainder of the year. His hand is all right now and he looks forward to a good season.

In seventy-eight games last year DeBerry mangled rival pitchers for a batting average of .285. Although Hank did not break into the three hundred class, his average was several points higher than that compiled by many of the dangerous batters in the league. In 235 trips to the batter Hank made 87 hits, which netted a total of 93 bases. Among his blows were eleven three-baggers and six home runs.

Next season the reliable Hank

should be better than last year. He is an enthusiastic ball player and possesses plenty of ability. As ball players are judged, Hank is not a youngster. He is 31 years old, and before being obtained from New Orleans by the Brooklyn he had a trial with the Cleveland team, but the capable Steve O'Neil was an obstruction in his path.

That was four or five years ago, and since then DeBerry has progressed rapidly. Next season he will receive an opportunity to do big things for Manager Robinson. The opening of the training season no doubt will find Hank ready to prepare himself to make the most of the chances that are certain to come his way this year.


