SAVING WATER

Regardless of the recent welcome rains, California is experiencing the driest winter in fifty years. The supply of water for all general and domestic purposes is far below normal.

This result is a smaller supply of water for generating electricity in the hydraulic plants, at the same time increasing the load due to the greater amount of power required by ranchers for irrigation.
