

and washable. Stuffed Spanish Onions.—Cut tops off six medium-sized onions, reserving the tops for covers. Secoop out as much of the onion as possible without breaking the sides. If there is too much onion meat for one's personal taste, reduce to amount required and chop in a chop-per; then add one teacup minced ham (or ground pork link sausage may be substituted), one teacup ground salt crackers, two eggs (beat-en), one-third cup celery (ground); stir all together with one teacup soup stock or one teacup milk. Fill onion shells with mixture until a thit site of bacon. Bake until sides of onions are tender and steeples are a golden brown. To remove grease spots from wool-en cloth use vinegar instead of gaso-line, as it removes it much quicker and does not leave a ring.

a golden brown. Sometimes when you remove a spot with gasoline you leave a ring about the part cleaned. You can remove this by holding it over the steam of the teaketile.

A tiny cross of contrasting color made in center front of bloomer saves time in distinguishing front from back. Another hint that may prove helpful is to attach a large safety pin to the rubber or tape when drawing it through casing. Then if it pulls through, it can easily be guided out again.

If linen is so badly scorched that the stain will not disappear by the application of lemon juice and salt, try the following mixture: A cup of vinegar, half an ounce of soap, two ounces of fuller's earth, and the juice of one lemon. Boil well, spread the solution over the scorched spots and let it dry. Wash the linen, and the stain will disappear.

If stains are boiled into materials they will never afterward come out. It is essential to care for them at

The use of dimity for win-dow curtains, ruffled bedspreads, dresser scarves, etc., is both dainty and refreshing. It also has the ad-vantage of being easy to launder.

To cook eggs for invalids or chil-dren, bring the water to a boil, take the saucepan off the fire and place the egg in it for five minutes. The egg will be cooked evenly and thor-oughly and the white will not be hard and indigestible.

An easy method of pressing clothes when speed is desired is to sprinkle the garments in the customary man-ner with water before ironing and then to spread over it a heavy paper instead of cloth. This method leaves no lint and is frequently much easier than when the customary pressing cloth is used.

A comfortable convenience for the sewing room is a padded, covered brick to which may be pinned a piece of sewing that needs to be held taut while hand-work is being done. It may be placed upon the sewing machine or a table, which is a much more comfortable arrangement than bending over the sewing pinned to one's knee. comfortable convenience for

Chamois leathers that are used for cleansing silver require frequent washing. The simplest way to do this is to squeeze them through the hands in warm water and scapsuds to which a few drops of ammonia have been added, changing the water if necessary. Rinse in warm scapsuds and hang out to dry, rubbing the leather through the hands a few times before it is dry to soften it. If rinsed in clear water leathers get hard.
