

"Personal appeals to representatives and senators by the lobbyists appear to have been largely discarded. The

method of attack now is for the representative of any par-ticular interest here, whenever that interest comes up in the house or senate, to send out calls to the various states and have organizations there write and telegraph senators

and representatives. A senator's mail is probably more than half pure propaganda.

DESPITE the refusal of the United States to enter the League of Nations, the League has called on several League of Nations, the League has called on several Americans to fill offices in the organization. The latest to be honored is Hugh S. Cumming, surgeon general of the United States public health service. Dr. Cumming has been made a vice-president of the S. permanent world health organization formed

But one never knows when the insidious propaganda of invisible government is having its effect. That it does have effect in many instances is too patently true. "My own personal view is that congress ought to pass a well considered law providing rules and regulations by which lobbyists can be registered and under which they may operate, and requiring the greatest publicity with respect to all lobbyists. Publicity is the best remedy."
