DINING CAR IN TUNNEL'S DEPTH

So successful has been the application of new inventions and modern methods, that the great Florence Lake tunned which the Southern California Edison Company is driving under the Kaiser range in the High Sierras mountains of northeastern Fresno County, will be completed one year and four months ahead of schedule time, according to a report handed President John B. Miller this morning by George C. Ward in charge of construction.

An innovation which has contributed greatly to the speed of operation is the unique dining car service provided for the tunnel workers. A train of electric trolley cars dives into the miles of excavated tunnel at meal time bearing hot food and coflee. The men are saved the long trip to the entrance of the tunnel, and, what is of more importance, the physical shockwhich comes from sudden exposure & the cold outside air is averted
