Hot cross buns may be made like any baking powder biscuit, or with the addition of sugar and raisins or currants, and of course with the cross scored on top. My favorite recipe is as follows: Scald one cup of milk and add while hot one-quarter cup sugar, one-quarter cup butter and one teaspoon salt. Let cool. Dissolve one-half yeastcake in one-half cup luke-warm water to which a little sugar has been added. When the milk has cooled to luke-warm add one or two well beaten eggs, the yeast, 'enough flour to make a batter and one cup small seeded raisins, and beat well. Add enough flour to make a soft dough, knead until smooth, and set in a warm place to rise. In about three hours roll out, cut into biscuits, score cross in the top of each one, and put into pan to rise for another hour. Cover top with a paste composed of sugar moistened with milk, sprinkle cinnaman on top, and bake. Hot cross buns may be made

one tablespoon green pepper (cut into cubes), three cups cream or white sauce, one-half cup shredded pimento, one-quarter teaspoon salt or celery salt. Wipe a shank of veal and put it to cook in boiling water enough to cover it. After ten minutes reduce the heat, season, and allow to simmer until tender. Cut meat into cubes and add it to the cream (or white sauce), green pepper and shredded pimento. It is nice to have the meat cooked the day before you are to use it. This is a good dish to prepare when yeal is expensive, and is dike the cit the starch a like the cit.

two cups of bread crumbs in cold water, wring dry, and stir with one cup of sifted flour into one pint of sour milk. Beat well. Let stand over night. Then add one well beaten egg, one teaspoon soda and one-half tea-spoon salt. Add more liquid or flour if necessary and use as any griddle-cake batter.

Potato Souffle.—Peel, wash and boil four large potatoes: When they are done drain and mash them. Add pepper, salt, butter, a gill of cream, grating of nutmeg, three egg yolks and the beaten whites. Heap the souffle in a buttered baking dish and bake it for about twenty minutes.

To mend fine lace curtains, starch a piece of mesh as near like the curtain as possible. Cut the starch-patch one inch larger each way than the place to be mended, and with a warm iron press it over the hole. If done carefully it will be difficult to detect the hole.

Indian Pudding.—Heat three cups of milk, add one-half cup of yellow cornmeal, and cook in double boiler about one hour. Add one egg well beaten, one-half cup sugar, one teaspoon cinnamon, and one cup of raisins. Bake about one hour slowly.
