During the existence of the extensive outbreak of foot and mouth disease in the United States in 1914-15 California's quarantine only applied to livestock and poultry. No other objection was raised against the shipment of any other material or agricultural products into the state from any of the twenty-one infected states. As a matter of fact, the state veterinarian of California called a meeting of officials of western states in San Francisco at that time. A uniform state quarantine regulation was adopted, which was put into force in the majority of the western states.

Neither in the discussion or final

Neither in the discussion or final enactment of this basic quarantine was anything other than livestock, chickens, hay, forage and packing ma-terial considered.

Never before were agricultural products, other than hay, straw, forage and similar materials, considered as sufficiently dangerous to be included in quarantine regulations to prevent spread of foot and mouth disease.
