pollection of fingerprints of criminals ever assembled under one

It is international in scope, and records are received currently from Great Brita's. France, Denmark, Argentine, Canada, and Mexico.

The collection was increased to 600,000 when the fingerprint records of the federal prison at Leavenworth Kan. were moved here and placed in charge of A. J. Rence of the department of Justice, official fingerprint custodian of the government.

From these hundreds of thousands of tell-tale marks Rence can identify a criminal if he has ever committed a previous crime.


