PROTECT BED SPRINGS The idea is new to me and strikes me as being a good one. Cover your bed springs with table oil cloth. Lap it over the edges and sew it to the spring to keep it from slipping. The springs are kept clean and the turning of the mattress is made very easy. Place the smooth side of the oil cloth up, of course, and where it is necessary to piece it, sew it on the machine with a long stitch.

Rice Pudding.—Put half a cup of rice to cook in the double boiler in one quart of milk. Cook until soft. Add half a cup of sugar, one-half teaspoon salt, yolks of two eggs, and any flavoring you wish. If you wish a chocolate pudding put two squares of chocolate, melted, in the rice. The grated rind of an orange and a little of the juice make a nice flavoring; grated lemon rind is equally good. Cook until thick, then pour into a serving dish, whip the whites of the eggs stiff, sweeten with confectioner's sugar, add a little orange or lemon juice if you have used the fruit for flavor, beat again, spread over the pudding. The meringue may be browned or not, as you choose. Serve cold.

SUGGESTIONS A piece of sandpaper put under both clamps of the food chopper, rough side up, will keep them from working loose and slipping. When whitewashing the cellar, add a few drops of bluing to whitewash, also add a small quantity of salt. This will make it a much whiter color and also make the whitewash cling much better to the wall.

Beef Stew.—Beef stew may usually be bought very cheap because the cheaper cuts of meat can be used. Have the butcher cut the meat in pieces of suitable size for serving. Brown in a little fat, then cover with water and let it simmer gently until tender. Add any vegetables you like—onions, potatoes, sweet peppers (the latter are usually better chopped), carrots, turnips, celery, and any left-over peas, beans, etc. If you do not creamed, you may thick the gravy with a little flour if you like.

Beets are made delicious by pouring over them, when cooked and sliced, the following: One and one-half cups of vinegar, one-fourth teaspoon salt, one and one-half cups sugar, two tablespoons butter, three-fourths tablespoon cornstarch. Mix the cornstarch, vinegar, sugar and salt. Let it come to a boil, stirring constantly. Cook five minutes, then beat in the butter. Pour over the beets and serve hot.

Crab Meat Salad.—Take one can crab meat, remove from can immediately on opening. Pick in three-quarters cup up celery. Mix crab meat and celery with thick mayonnaise. Have a large platter ready. Put sufficient leaves of head lettuce on to cover. Fill the lettuce leaves with mixed celery and crab meat. Slice tomatoes (over cooled) over top in orderly rows, and in center row, slice hard-boiled eggs. On top of each slice tomato put dab of mayonnaise. In making this salad have all ingredients well drained and your mayonnaise thick; otherwise an unappetizing, watery salad will result. This salad may be varied by using shrimps or lobster in place of crab meat.

Rice Croquettes.—Take one cup cold cooked rice, add one well beaten egg. Drop by spoonfuls on greased frying pan. Turn when brown. Serve with jam.

Berry Shortcake.—Take sufficient pie crust dough for one pie, roll medium thin, have buttered pie plate, lay on flat, and bake brown and crisp. Split, butter, and cut berries between and on top. Recipe for pie crust calls for six tablespoons flour, four tablespoons shortening and butter mixed, two tablespoons ice water. It is easy to remember, being multiples of two.

French Fried Potatoes.—Potatoes may be fried in the morning and put in hot oven for few minutes when ready to serve.
