Three New Wells Go on Production Within 48 Hours

Three small wells were placed on production in the Torrance-Lofnita field yesterday and the day before.

The Petroleum Securities Company completed its first well in the eastern part of the field, when Kleinmeyer No. A-1 was swabbed into production from 3860 feet for a yield of 300 barrels a day. The Kleinmeyer is the first of twelve wells to get production on the big holdings of the Doheny organization in the eastern extension. Several more are nearing the productive formation and will be producing within the next two weeks.

In the far western end of the field the Standard Oil Company brought in Potter No. 1 for a daily production of 100 barrels on the pump. The bottom of the hole is 3600 feet. It is the first well to be completed on the Potter lease.

The Standard also brought in Marble No. 17 on the pump. Completed at 3825 feet, the well is making 100 barrels a day.

PRESIDENT COOLIDGE has definitely taken a stand against further expenditures for battleships and in favor of a greatly augmented air force.

The world flight of American aviators, the experiments demonstrating the efficacy of air bombing planes against battleships, and the recent dawn-to-darkness flight across the continent have established the necessity of a large air force for purposes of defense. It requires no undue elasticity of the imagination to vision the transportation of a great land force from any part of the country to any other part within a few hours.

With enough submarines, a vast fleet of aeroplanes and airships, our coasts can be made inviolate against invaders.

It is gratifying to see that the President realizes this, despite the shouts of the navy clique for a great navy and a huge sea-force personnel.
