When selecting vegetables, take care to notice whether or not they have been soaked in water to freshen them. If so, they are not at their best. This is one of the advantages of selecting such things per-sonally, rather than trusting to the telephone or a 'messenger. Beets should have green leaves, some of which are rather dirty, otherwise one suspects that the wilted spinach has been soaked in water to revive it. Cabbage should be heavy and firm, with orisp inner white leaves. Car-rots should be hard and firm and not too large. Onions should be hard and firm, espe-cially when pressed at the stem end. Squash should be hard, without any soft spots.
