# Hoover's Hope for Laborers Cut Waste, Raise Pay, Advice

COMMERCE SECRETARY HOOVER, referring in a recent speech to the growth of interest by labor in its responsibility for the functioning of the whole economic machine, declared that the fund from which labor must xpect the maintenance of present wages or an increase a real wages lies in more efficient production and the limination of waste.

"What I am referring to is the type of waste in
lustry which arises from bad co-ordination of instry as a whole," said Hoover.

In discussing the relationship of labor to the problem of better co-ordination to eliminate waste, Mr. Hoover said labor deserved to participate in the gains made as the result of the elimination of waste, and he felt that from the savings made in this way labor would have to expect the maintenance of present wages and the ad-

"The savings we can make through the amplification of invention, through increase in skill, through elimination of collective wastes, is bound to be divided over the consumer," he said. "It should be divided over labor to secure service and contentment, and as a matter of fact it will be divided over capital because capital comes cheaper with increasing security.

"If we would examine our utilities, many of our ler and larger manufacturing concerns, from this point view, we would find that an astonishing proportion our national production and service is now operating various degrees under this regime of a new contained of capital, management, labor, and the content.

"Intelligent Self-Interest"

"Intelligent Self-Interest"
"Of those concerns which we commonly refer to as big business' I would not be surprised to find a considerable majority now evolving into this field. Thirty years ago we would not have believed this possible. Nor are these tendencies based upon any abandonment of self-interest as a motive power in production. Just a little more intelligent self-interest, with perhaps a little larger proportion of that salt of altruism found in the impulse to personal accomplishment and in responsibility to widespread numbers—and to public opinion.

"He would be a rash man who would state that we are finally entering the industrial millennium, but there is here a great ray of hope that America is finding herself in a solution of the greatest of all her problems; that is, a method by which social satisfaction is to be attained with the preservation of private industry, of initiative and full development of the individual. It is idle to argue that there are at times no conflicts of interest between the employe and the employer. But there are wide areas of activity in which their interests should coincide, and it is the part of statesmanship, on both sides to organize this identity of interests in order to limit the area of conflict. There is an identity of interest in the elimination of industrial waste. In all this setting it has become far more possible to deal with the problem of waste elimination than ever before in our history, for co-operative action is easier to summon today than ever before and more certain of action. To deal with waste by such action is to strengthen these very foundations of a better relationship between employer and employe.

"Labor can play a large part in these questions. Nor is labor's part that of distasteful speeding up to the ultimate production of nervous human wrecks. It lies in the study of where the major wastes of industry lie in relation to labor, where labor can play its part in the field of identity of interest; not in the field of reduced wages or longer hours,


