The Torrance Hospital Association has pursued and will continue to pursue a policy of buying in Torrance.

Miss Esther Maxwell, superintendent of the Jared Sidney Torrance Memorial hospital, announced that when the hospital is operating groceries and meats will be purchased locally. Each grocer and butcher will enjoy the hospital patronage in rotation, a month at a time. Original grocery supplies were purchased at Paige's market.

In buying supplies and furniture and equipment for the hospital the association in most instances traded with home-town merchants.

All the furniture in the hospital was provided by Huddleston's. The order to Mr. Huddleston included all the furniture for patients' rooms and the reception room.

The hospital has been completely stocked with pure drugs from the

Dolley Drug Company and Torrance Pharmacy, both local drug stores.

The DeBra Radio Company installed an Atwater Kent, model 20, capable of receiving programs from all Pacific coast stations, as well as Chicago and the east. The control will be in the office, with head-sets on every bed, so that any patient can "listen in" without disturbing any other. A loud speaker is installed in the nurses' room for dancing and group entertainment.

The radio will be tuned in during both opening days for the entertainment of visitor, Mr. DeBra announced.

The Atwater Kent was equipped with Willard batteries by Harvel Guttenfelder of the Torrance Auto Electric.

The hospital and the equipment therein were provided with all

necessary insurance policies by Torrance agents—A. H. Bartlett, Tom Foley, and George W. Neill. Draperies, linens, pillows, blankets, shades, curtains, bedspreads and sheets were supplied by Rappaport's.

Hospital-printed forms of every variety and the 20-page illustrated booklet describing the hospital and the hospital association were printed by The Torrance Herald. Complete service was provided by The Herald in the preparation of the booklet, from assisting in the preparation of copy, the supervision of taking photographs, and supplying halftones, to printing and binding.

The pictures shown in the hospital booklet were taken by George LaPlante of LaPlante's Studio. Despite the fact that the pictures were taken during the rush of completing the hospital, unusually excellent results were obtained by Mr. LaPlante.
