

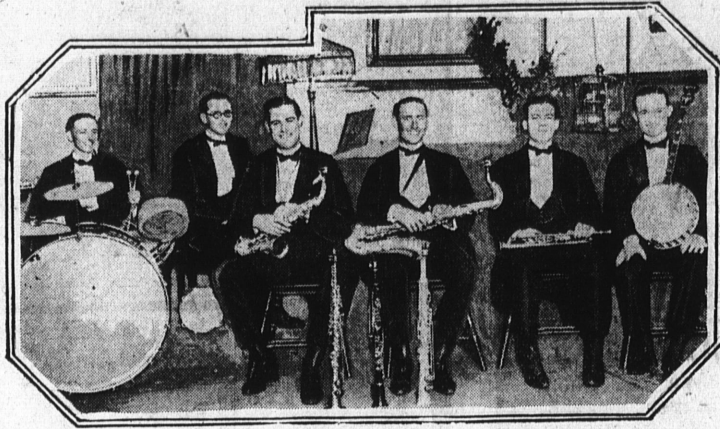

The law itself recognizes that there are degrees of misconduct. A man who steals five dollars cannot, according to law, be sentenced to serve as long as a man who steals \$500.

With these degrees recognized, it seems to me that the man who attacks a girl is guilty of a greater crime than a man who robs a bank. Likewise it must be evident that a man whose actions threaten the chastity of a young girl is a greater menace to the peace of society than a vagrant or a dice player.

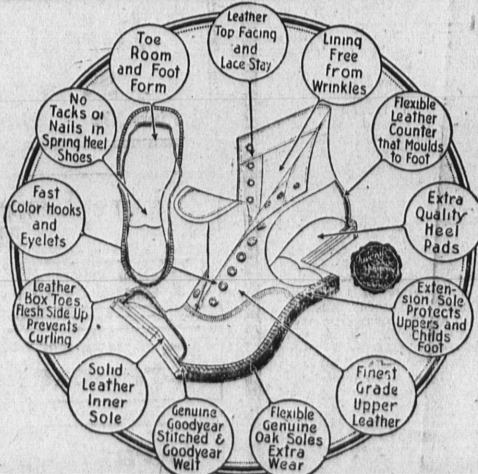
