WILL BORE NEW HOLE IN HILLS

Petroleum Securities Hauls Material for Second Test Well EAST OF WESTERN AVE. Hope for Producer Spurred by Showings in First Wildcat

The Petroleum Securities Corporation is hauling material for a second test well to be drilled in the Palos Verdes Hills south of the Long Beach-Redondo boulevard and east of Western avenue. It is officially stated that the first test well, west of Western avenue, will be abandoned. It was drilled below 4000 feet. Showings of oil picked up in the first test hole lead operators to believe it possible that a commercial oil structure may be located to the east. The Petroleum Securities lease demands that the company drill two wells.

SCHOOL NEWS

EVENING HIGH SCHOOL An announcement of great interest to the "tired housewife" is the opening of a course in the evening school called "Cookery and Home Management." Miss Helen Collier, the teacher of domestic science at the high school, will have charge of the class. The evenings on which the class will meet has not been determined, but will probably be adjusted to suit the majority of the class and Miss Collier. The course will open as a special short-unit class and will include a study of foods, practical cookery, planning of meals, table service, and the making of menus for the family and for special occasions. Attention will be paid also to the individual problems and interests of the members of the class. Fifteen members must enroll in order to maintain the class, but owing to the equipment being limited, the first twenty-four will be given preference in the organization of the course. the high school, or Mr. Bell, principal of the evening school, for further information or to reserve a place in this new class.

This class is being planned to meet the demand of wives of the community as well as to fill the needs of brides-to-be who feel a lack in their own ingenuity in having "something different for dinner" which greatly appeals to the tired husband. Without doubt it will be one of the most attractive offerings of the evening school this year.

Public speaking and sewing classes are to be discontinued at the end of this semester (Jan. 29) if the attendance has not increased. The maintenance of a class is a considerable expense, and the present administration of the evening school does not want to offer courses in which the people of the community fail to see a definite fulfillment of a need.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL Friday, Jan. 29, is the date set for the presentation in the high school auditorium of the pageant, "America—Yesterday and Today." One hundred and fifty children of

the school are rehearsing daily, and it is expected that this patriotic production will equal or excel anything produced by the elementary school children in several years. Tickets are now on sale at the school and through the children. Three prices have been set. Adult admission either Friday afternoon or evening is 25 cents. High school admission for the matinee is 15 cents, but 25 cents in the evening. Elementary school pupils may attend either matinee or evening for 10 cents.

Proceeds of this entertainment are to be used for subscriptions to magazines for the children, purchase of certain equipment for the new building which is not supplied by the Board of Education, the serving of refreshments for the P.-T.-A., and other expenses of the school.

"America—Yesterday and Today" is a pageant in three episodes, by Nina Lamkin, showing the progress of America through the ages. Episode 1 shows the spirit of the Indian days. Episode 2 shows the spirit of the wilderness, with the flowers, butterflies, bluebirds, grasshoppers, trees, and mist maidens. Episode 3 shows the pioneer

conquering the forest, and civilization, with education, art, science and patriotism marching on. Then come the peoples from other lands, who pledge allegiance and loyalty to our flag.
