

WIFE SAVERS Royal Scallop.—Six eggs, one cup I cracker crumbs, one-haif cup but, ter, one quart milk, two tables-boons flour, two tablespoons but, ther, sait. Boit the eggs until hard; chop whites fine and press the yolks through size. Miosten the gracker erimbs with one-half cup melted butter. Make a white sauce as follows: Melt two tablespoons butter, add flour and stir until

smooth, then add one quart of hot milk. Cook until alieshty thick, add salt to taste. Butter a baking dish. Put in a layer of crumbs, then a portion of white sauce, then ham, whites and yolks of eggn. Repeat until all is used, having crumbs on top. Bake in a moderate oven about one-half hour. Crumbs on top should be a nice golden brown. Thousand Island Dressing.— One onion finely chopped, two cold boiled beets finely chopped, one-half cup thin mayonnaise, one tablespoon chill sauce, three Apple Tart.—Prepare enough dough for bottom crust only. Put in pie pan and cover with three-quarters cup sugar and one tablespoon flour mixed. Pare, core and haive apples. Arrange nicely on sugar and flour, and dot each piece with butter and sprinkle with oinna-mon. Pour a cup of water over all and bake until apples are done. Serve when still warm.
