E. H. WATSON, Michigan bank director and finan-quarter who has been making Torrance his head-quarter while touring Southern California told The Herald today that he regards Torrance as the most promising small city he has seen in the Southland. "Unlike so many of the Southern California cities," said Mr. Watson, "Torrance seems to be growing in accordance with a splendid city plan. A city that is properly planned, that is built on a solid foundation, such as your local industries, is destined to go con-stantly forward.

"Boom towns that sprout like mushrooms without n soon reach a limit. But a city that adheres to a definite plan grows steadily.

"Torrance seems to combine industry with beauty in a wonderful manner. That is a combination that is difficult to achieve. Yet Torrance certainly has achieved it. The whole idea in city building in modern times is to lay a firm foundation for the city to build on and then keep one eye all the time on those things which make a city a good place in which to live. You have the foundation in your industries. In addition you have a beautiful city, with splendid parks, fine schools, excellent streets, wonderful trees.

A GOOD INVESTMENT FOR TORRANCE

TORRANCE already is paying 5 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation for promotion and advertising through the medium of the Chamber of Commerce.

To approve the 10-cent levy for the Chamber will be a good investment for all the taxpayers of Torrance—for those who pay large sums each year and for those who own their homes and are not so primarily interested in increasing values in Torrance.
