

Buron Fitts, candidate for the republican nomination for lieutenant governor, is rapidly gaining strength in Los Angeles County, as indicated by the formation within the last two weeks of 35 Fitts-for-Lieutenant-Governor Clubs in communities throughout the county. Keith Carlin, campaign manager, declares that almost a score more Fitts clubs will be functioning in the county before the primaries, August 31.


