Fifteen years ago Barley, Beans and Beets were the principal crops of this whole area known today as the City of Torrance.

The first building of any sort was a frame shed erected near what is now the corner of Cravens and Carson streets. It was used for a bunk- and cookhouse and it represented the first effort for the benefit of our community.

Next came the actual conversion of the ranch into a real "Modern Industrial City," with sewers, paved streets, public utilities, sidewalks, curbs, residences, business blocks, shops, etc., and this was the suprementerprise for the benefit of our community.

In December of 1912 the writer opened a store in the Colonial Building, which store was later moved to the Brighton Building, where for 12 years it served the community. For quite a while it was an uphill climb; yet it cannot be denied that this first store in Torrance was a boon to the seven families already living here in 1912 and to the hundreds of families who came to live here in the years that followed.

The building of the Torrance Theatre, in which the writer had a minor part, is only second in benefits derived to the erecting and operating of the "Jared Sidney Torrance Memorial Hospital." In which one of our prominent physicians had a major part.
