

Guild Pays Off Parish Hall Note; Members Celebrate

Members of the Episcopal Women's Guild and their families enjoyed Pot Luck supper at the Parish Hall Friday evening in celebration of the paying off a note given the Episcopal Church Extension Society at the three of the building of the Parish Hall. This note that was given January 5, 1925, was to run for three years, but the women of the guild, by their hard and

earnest work, paid it off on December 2, 1926, 13 months and three days before it was due thus establishing a precedent in the diocese, such a thing never happening before.

With the paying of this note the mission is entirely clear of debt and with the coming of the new rector, Rev. Harold H. Kelley, who has been in charge of St. Peter's church since 1920, the mission is looking forward to new activity among the Episcopalians of Torrance and vicinity.

The mission owns two beautiful lots on Ingraham Avenue, next door

to the Women's Club and opposite the Torrance Memorial Hospital and it is the aim of the members of the mission to erect a church upon these lots some day that will be in keeping with the buildings surrounding them.

Rev. Harold H. Kelley, will take charge of the services of the Mission next Sunday and all Episcopalians are asked to confer and give him a hearty welcome. Also all others who have not established a church home in Torrance.

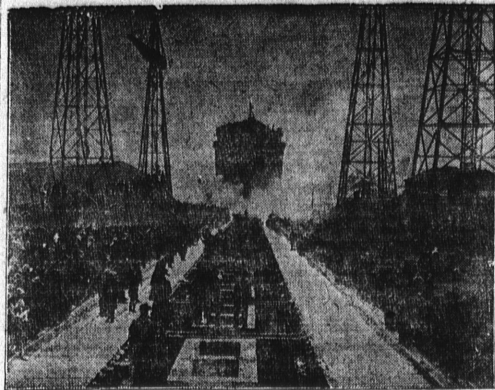

Reinstate Vets' Policies, Says Pres. Coolidge

San Francisco—President Coolidge has again called upon the World War Veterans of the nation, who have permitted their war risk insurance to lapse, to renew their policies.

"Many veterans do not seem to know about the continuance of the war risk insurance after the war," the President declares in a message received by State Adjutant James K. Fisk of the American Legion, "and its conversion within a limited time into such form or forms of insurance usually insured by life insurance companies."

The President has designated the week of January 31 to February 7 as a period for a nation-wide effort to induce the ex-service men and women to reinstate their lapsed insurance.
