But inasmuch as the type of post is already stipulated, and because only one company makes this post,
real competitive bids are impossible. Other contractors who wish to enter bids must buy this certain post from the manufacturer, but the cost thereof is so much higher than the cost of the manufacturer that the in dependent contractor has no chanc

- Did anyone ever see an independent contractor win a bid, for a patent-paving job in competition with the
holder of the patent? Yes. But on so few occasions holder of the patent? Yelu. that in all these cases
that it is logical to conclude there was an understanding between the patent-holder and the contractor.
The same conditions exist when lighting systems are concerned. Advance specification of type of post
almost certainly will ellminate competition and inalmost certainly will ellminate competition and in-
