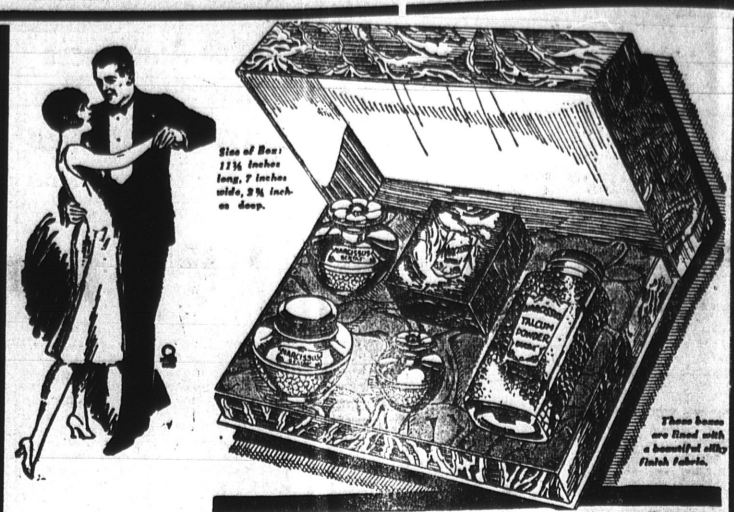
**Dolley Drug Co. Is Branch Office for Circle's '7th Heaven'**
