Timely Gardening Hints

As Told by Expert

haracteristics of the old Spanish ardens may aid us in determining hat to plant in the patio of the outhern California home.

Colored tile gives the dominatg note to the Spanish patio. On the coping of the tile basin are often found alternate blue and white glazed pots containing plants which vary with the season, red geraniums, carnations and purple lilles appear most often with never two colors appearing at the same time. Other flowers frequently used are roses, chrysanthemums, amaranth and cockscomb.

If there are bare walls in the court there may be an excavation two feet wide and one foot deep int its base in which qre planted vines or trees. Plants more commonly used for the wall cover are bougainvillea, lantana, grape, orange, lemon, geranium and eypress. They have no low planting against the walls. Jars containing plants whomen as mostruo delicloso are often placed along the walk or edge of the arcade.

Dahlas that have been long in bloom should be cut back severely to induce new growth strong enough to bear late flowers. Now, is a good time to propagate roses from cuttings of half ripe wood.

This is the season to plant ferns in a shady place. They do best in a sandy place, They do best in a sandy place of learmoid or humus. Seeds of stocks, sweet peas, pansies, calceolarea and cineraria may be planted now. Also set out plants of asters, maritodis, fuch-sias, zinnias, myostis and gaillaria.

Two bulbs that do best if planted now are Lillium candidum, the familiar Madonna Lily and the dainty little Freesia. The Amarylis beliadona is best separated and planted soon after blooming.
