opment in this engaging commercial combat between the Royal Dutch-Shell interests of Europe and the Standard Oil group here is the entrance of a Royal-Dutch subsidiary into Ohio as a large-scale producer and refiner.

The period of postwar deflation seems to be nearing a drop of the curtain. The next act in the international economic drama probably will reveal a number of industrial giants struggling for world business. If so, Governments must play their parts. The outstanding activities of the Harding and Coolidge Administrations were concerned with postwar readjustments and deflation. One of the chief problems of American business and of the next few Administrations will be to meet the vast trade expansion now under way in Europe.

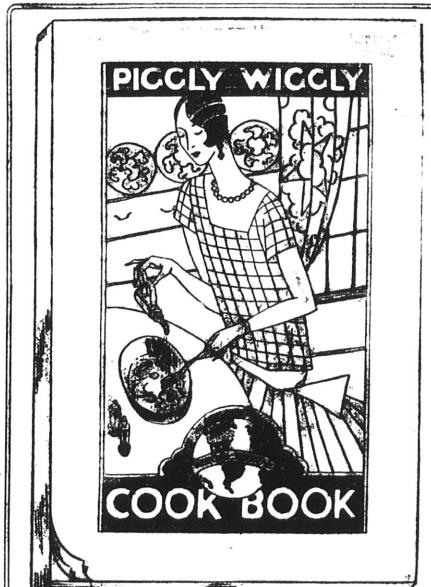
