

Why Not a Dominguez Memorial?-Industrial Southern California-Southland More Than a Haven for Tourists, Intersting Figures Reveal

IT is more than a pity that there is no permanent memorial in this district to the memory of the Dominguez family. That family once owned a vast area of land in what is now the south-western part of Los Angeles county. Their old ranch-house still stands. But their old ranch has been divided among heirs, sold off here and there and become gradually assimilated by the requirements of modern civilizatiou.

And yet the history of this section in the days when the old rancheros held their fiestas is as picturesque as the pioneering record of almost any district in the country. We hate to see all the Dominguez holdings pass into other hands, be given over to industrial and residential purposes without some provision of a memorial to the memory of the first of the Dominguez family.
