Avalon, Catalina Island.—A huge funeral urn fashloned out of native stone as skilfully as though turned out by a lathe, weighing lide and shill welf a huge landslide near the interest of the stone of a small girl child, was found buried with 4 other small children piled in tiers of four deep around it by Prof. Ralph Gildden curator of the Catalina Museum for the Channel Indians. The richness of the artifacts found buried in the urn which included many, some 50,000, minute carved shell beads, crystal studded and abalone, inlaid fultes, daggers and hair pins, pearl pendants, miniature carved birds and fish, jasper knife blades, spear head and arrow tips, would, indicate the child to have been of royal birth.
