

Another postponement jn the matter of hearing of the mandamus of the city council in the calling of the recall election, concerning Councilman Ramage, was the result of another day in court when the clerk of the court made an error in setting the case, the record showing it to be at 10 o'clock, August 20, instead of 2 o'clock as the contestants were notified.

At 10 o'clock the citse was called and as neither side was in evidence the matter was taken off the galendar. In the afternoon the two sides were present and ready for hearing. When notified of the action of the court the matter, was explained and the case brought back on the calendar and set for Friday. August 31. A number of interested citizens were present and were disappointed in not having the case heard.

It is predicted in many circles now that with the annexation election so near the recall mandamus will probably not be heard until after that time. In the event this city joins Los Angeles, the council will automatically be retired. If the election decides against annexation then there will be but slight grounds on which to base a decision of the council in not calling the election, as the petitions were declared sufficient by the city elect's office after checking. All excuses for not calling it will then be eliminated.
