Notice of Trustee's Sale
WHEREAS, by a deed of trust dated August 13, 1926, and recorded September 23, 1926, in Book 5317, Page 331 of Official Records of Los Angeles County, California, WILLIAM J. McNAMARA, a widow, conveyed and conveyed the property therein and hereinafter described to BANK OF ITALY NATIONAL TRUST AND SAVINGS ASSOCIATION, a banking association, organized and existing under the laws of the United States of America, in trust, to secure, among other things, the payment of two promissory notes, in favor of P. S. VENABLE and BERNICE S. VENABLE, his wife, as joint tenants, and other sums of money advanced and interest thereon; and WHEREAS, BANK OF ITALY NATIONAL TRUST AND SAVINGS ASSOCIATION, a banking association, organized and existing under the laws of the United States of America, is now the trustee under said deed of trust; and WHEREAS, P. S. VENABLE and BERNICE S. VENABLE, husband and wife, the owners and holders of said notes and deed of trust have been obliged to and have paid out and advanced the sum of \$775.48 for the purpose of protecting the interests of said trust, said payment and advance- ment having been made in accordance with the provisions of said deed of trust and being secured thereby; and WHEREAS, there has been a default in the payment of principal in the amount of \$461.00 and interest thereon from August 31, 1927, at seven (7) percent per annum and by reason of the defaults in the said promissory note, according to the terms thereof and as provided in the said deed of trust, the note for \$32,100.00, secured by the said deed of trust, is also declared in default as to the said principal sum of \$32,100.00 and interest thereon from August 11, 1927, and a default in the payment of the moneys advanced in accordance with the provisions of said deed of trust, and by reason of such defaults, the said P. S. VENABLE and BERNICE S. VENABLE, the owners and holders of said notes and deed of trust, on to-wit, June 26, 1928, exercised their option and declared the full amount of the indebtedness secured by said deed of trust immediately due and payable, there being the total sum of \$32,000.01 now due and unpaid; and WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2924 of the Civil Code of California, the said P. S. VENABLE and BERNICE S. VENABLE, the owners and holders of said notes and deed of trust on June 30, 1928, caused to be recorded in the office of the County Recorder of Los Angeles County, a notice of such default in the payment of principal and interest and of their election to cause the property described in said deed of trust to be sold in accordance with the provisions thereof to satisfy said obligation, which notice of default and election to sell was duly recorded in Book 8790, Page 29 of Official Records of said Los Angeles County, and by reason of such defaults, the said P. S. VENABLE and BERNICE S. VENABLE, the owners and holders of said notes and deed of trust, are hereby notified that, if there is default in the payment of any of the sums secured thereby, upon application of the holders of said notes, the trustee shall give notice and sell so much of the property as shall be necessary to satisfy the indebtedness secured thereby; and WHEREAS, the said P. S. VENABLE, by reason of the default in payments, as stated, have requested the BANK OF ITALY NATIONAL TRUST AND SAVINGS ASSOCIATION to give notice and to sell said property, or so much thereof as shall be necessary to sell, to pay all the indebtedness secured and expenses incurred necessary to the execution of said trust;
