Torrance Man Halted by Woman With Bullet Above Her Heart

Orville Lamers of Torrance was plotting his automobile along Anaheim road near North Gaffey street. It was dark. Suddenly in front of his headlights loomed the figure of a woman. She gesticulated frantically. Lamers stopped his car. The woman leaped to the running board, told Lamers she had just shot herself. He sped her to the Wilmington Emergency hospital, where she was found to be in a serious condition with a bullet over her heart. After first aid treatment she was taken to the General hospital.

The woman told Detective Ficken of the San Pedro police division that she was penniless, had gone without food or sleep for three days and nights.

The woman was well-dressed, of refined appearance. Detective Ficken went to the spot where she said she attempted suicide. He found a 45 caliber revolver with only one shell in the chamber. Police are investigating the woman's story of attempted suicide.
