Rose Authority Speaks to Club

Garden Group Hears John Van Barneveld Monday Night

Before the large crowd that filled the American Legion clubhouse at the regular meeting of the Garden club last Monday evening, John Van Barneveld, authority on roses, spoke on the budding, growing and care of roses.

Mr. Van Barneveld was an interesting speaker and well able to take care of the subject that he spoke on, for that is the thing he is most interested in. He is in charge of all the hybridizing, propagating and trying out new varieties of roses for Howard and Smith at Los Angeles.

Mr. Barneveld began his talk by telling in detail how roses are laid out on the strong roots of the rugged robin, and each step of the making this bud grow into a fine rosebush. He discussed the preparation of the soil for planting, the proper kind of fertilizer, diseases of roses was another topic, and also the insects that are liable to attack the rose.

One of the main features was the discussion of varieties of roses, and Mr. Van Barneveld named and discussed 12 varieties that were particularly adapted to this damp climate near the ocean.

Following are the varieties named: Louise Catherine Breslau, Mrs. W. C. Egan, Padre, Hossier Beauty, Rose Marie, Souy, Le George Pernet, William E. Dorer and Los Angeles. Among the newer varieties, Dame Edith Helen, Lady Florence Stanger, Mrs. Eskine Pembroke Thom, and Margaret McGredy. 1929 roses suited are Miss Rowena Thom, Madam Henri Quenille, and Duchess of Athol.

At the meeting announcements were made concerning the coming international flower show at Encinitas for May starting Feb. 21. C. B. Bell, president of the Garden club and John King, Torrance nurseryman plan to go down early on the morning of the show and arrange the booth that Torrance is to have.

This booth has been made possible by finances from the Chamber of Commerce, and will advertise Torrance as the Modern Industrial City. Mr. Bell and Mr. King have made many plans as to the decorating, and hope to have a booth that will be very beautiful and advertise our city. They will be assisted in their work by Charles J. Bornwasser of the R and B Palmda Gardens at Bell, who has offered his services and enclosed commercial card gratis.

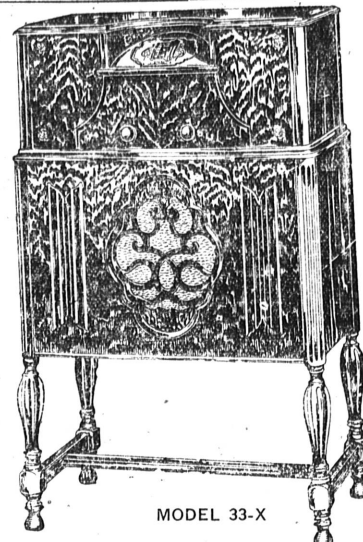

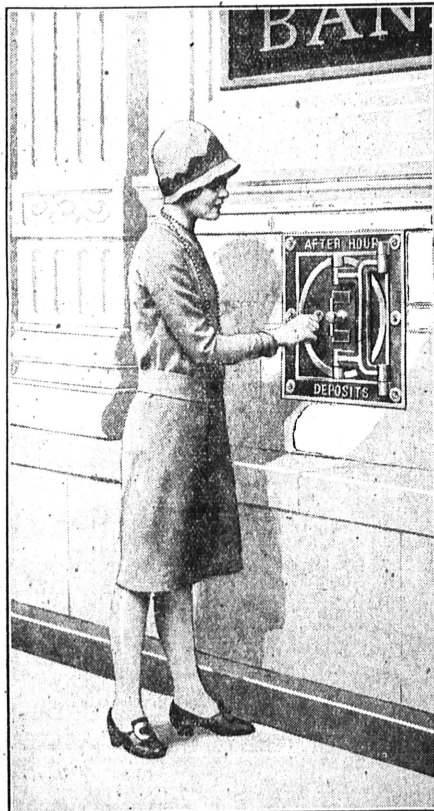

After Hour Deposit Safe Is Installed by First National



View of Depositor Operating Out-Door After-Hour Deposit Safe at Bank.

In keeping with its policy of rendering a complete banking service, the First National Bank of Torrance had installed by the O. B. McClintock company of Minneapolis, Minn., an after hour depository, which gives to the institution's clientele a twenty-four-hour deposit service every day in the year.

"The after hour deposit system is a distinct service to merchants, filling station operators, theatre managers, restaurant proprietors and others who are afforded the advantage of depositing their receipts at any time during the night, where they will be amply protected," said J. W. Post, president of the bank, "and we believe the depositor will appreciate being relieved of the inconvenience and danger of guarding receipts taken in after banking hours."

"One of the outstanding features of the after hour depository is that the depository itself completes every deposit the customer commences."

"The depositor simply unlocks and opens the bronze entrance door and pulls out a deposit receiving carrier, into which he drops his deposit bag. The instant he releases his grasp upon the carrier the carrier returns automatically to its closed position, sending the deposit swiftly from the carrier, through the chute, and into the safe within the bank."

"No pushing, lifting, turning or other manual effort is required to return the carrier to its closed position—to complete the making of the deposit. The depository does

the work automatically. "The return of the deposit receiving carrier and the force-feed delivery of the deposit bag into the safe are a single automatic operation."

"An electrical counting device, located at some convenient place within the bank, automatically records the number of times the deposit entrance door is opened."

"The customer is reminded by an electrical buzzer to close and lock the door after making deposit; he cannot remove his key until he has locked the door."

"The entire after hour depository has complete grade 'A' electrical protection connected to the bank's burglar alarm system. A burglarious attack upon the after hour depository will sound the loud alarm."

"Also, if the receiving carrier is held drawn forward more than two minutes an alarm will result. The carrier cannot be left drawn out, because the moment it is released it returns automatically."

"To anyone seeing the attractive cast bronze entrance door with its bronze crane hinge and the name, 'After Hour Deposits' it conveys an impression of strength and stability consistent with the institution of banking and regular vault and safe equipment," Mr. Post explained.
