Speed to Deep Sand in Race for Production at Lawndale

By J. B. DIXON HAWTHORNE-LENNOX ADVERTISER Thirty wells are drilling, fifty-six derricks are up and excavations are under way on a dozen more locations. These are some of the outstanding facts today in the amazing development of the Lawndale oil field, scarcely more than a month old, and there is no sign of a moment's letup in the intense rivalry among major and minor oil companies of all patterns to obtain a foothold and develop their holdings.

Where the big production will be found is a matter of less than sixty days. Veteran drillers say the field is the easiest drilled they have ever seen and all wells are making phenomenal progress. Only one well so far has had a fishing job and it was over within two and a half hours.

The Standard Oil Vane No. 1 is leading in the race. Careful estimates yesterday afternoon revealed a depth of approximately 4700 feet, which means that it has less than 1500 feet more to go to reach the pay-sands.

The field is now more than three miles long and a mile and a quarter wide, but the greatest development is still along Ingleswood avenue, between Chicago and Maryland.

Lease of School Property Sought

HAWTHORNE.—While no action has been taken by the board of trustees of the Ingleswood Union high school district, it is known that the question of leasing a portion of the fifteen acre-high school site on Rosecrans avenue east of Hawthorne boulevard in Lawndale has been placed squarely before the board by tempting offers which have been made by several oil companies who are anxious to drill on this site.

While the proposition of leasing a part of the property for oil drilling is going to be given consideration by the board, it will in no way interfere with the construction of the high school on part of the site. No information can be given out as to the details of the offers which oil company representatives have made to the board, but it is known that they are very attractive, and if the field extends as far east as the school property such a lease would in all probability be the source of lucrative income to the district.

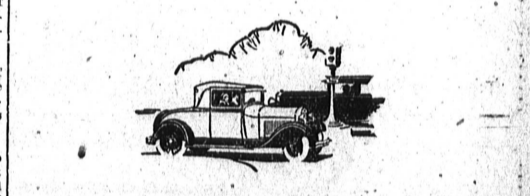
