## Refreshing Eats for This Week

### TOMATO RAREBIT

2 tablespoons butter.  
2 tablespoons flour.  
2 cups strained tomato or tomato soup.

1/4 teaspoon paprika.  
1 cup grated cheese.  
1 cup sauerkraut.  
Melt butter, add flour and when brown add tomato. Stir until mixture, add seasonings. Put over hot water. A double boiler is excellent for making all rarebits, for cheese needs a low temperature. Beat in the grated cheese and continue heating until cheese is thoroughly melted. Stir in the sauer-

kraut and when thoroughly heated pour over triangles of hot toast. This is a good late supper dish.

### RAINY DAY GOODY

Cook salad macaroni in boiling water 15 minutes, drain, rinse, add one-half cup onion, bean and pack in ring form around large platter. Heat one can salmon, pour into center of macaroni ring. Place thereon one slice bacon. Add flour to grease in pan, make thick gravy with water or milk and pour over top.

### FRUIT SALAD IN ORANGE CUPS

2 oranges  
2 slices pineapple.  
12 marshmallows.  
1-3 cup nut meats.  
2-3 cup white grapes.  
Cut oranges in two; remove pulp carefully; then pull out all sections, leaving orange cups. Cut pineapple, marshmallows and nuts in small pieces; skin and seed the grapes and mix all with orange pulp. Fill orange cups, cover with cream mayonnaise and garnish with grapes and nuts. Serve on lettuce.

### HONEY CORN FLAKE MUFFINS

1 1/2 cups cornflakes  
1 1/2 cups graham flour.  
2 cups white flour  
1 tablespoonful shortening.  
2 cups milk  
1/4 cup honey  
5 (teaspoonful) baking powder.  
Mix melted shortening with honey, add to one egg beaten lightly, then add milk. Stir in the dry ingredients which have been thoroughly mixed. Bake in well-greased muffin tins for thirty minutes. (Will make 32 muffins).

### ARKANSAS HAM

Ham in thin slices  
3 tablespoons vinegar  
1 1/2 teaspoons sugar  
Paprika  
1 1/2 teaspoons mustard.  
Cook thin slices of ham in hot frying pan until slightly browned. Put in the pan add the vinegar, sugar, paprika and mustard, well mixed. When mixture is thoroughly heated, pour over ham and serve at once. Ham cut about an inch thick is sometimes preferred to the thin slices.

1 1/2 pounds flank steak  
3/4 cups soft crumbs  
1 cup chopped prunes

Mix sugar and shortening together. Mix and sift dry ingredients. Add the applesauce to the first mixture and then add the dry ingredients. Beat well. Bake in a loaf pan for 45 minutes or in a layer pan for 25 minutes.
