(Continued from Page 1) poured in a circle around the plant but far enough away that it will not burn roots or foliage. It troubles from slugs and snails is especially common about each plant. Do not allow seed formation or blooming will stop. The delphinium will bloom several times each summer if flower stems are cut back and seeding prevented.

Delphiniums are fairly easy to raise from seed but for blooming this summer, the seeds should have been started last fall. However, fine young plants may be bought at a moderate price and if given proper care should be in bloom for the show. It is sincerely hoped by the show management that a splendid showing of these regal flowers will be made at the Torrance show this year and if so the growing of delphiniums need never be urged again, everybody will want them and have them. Watch these columns later for further information concerning the different varieties and types of delphinium and how to grow them from seed.
