Shriners Will Come by Train Loads in June
 Convention Only One Month Away—Huge Plans Made
 By GNPA Service
 Los Angeles, Calif., May 2.—Thousands of Shrine delegates to the 55th annual Shrine convention here June 4, 5 and 6 will begin to arrive in Southern California on the morning of June 1, according to a statement from Laitoy M. Edwards, director general of the convention.

The main army of Shrine hosts will reach Los Angeles on Sunday, June 2, in time for the Hollywood Bowl concert, which will be open to the public. Edwards estimates the probable number of visitors at 100,000 and is of the opinion that approximately half will remain in California for two weeks after the convention.

Plans for the Shrine Maximum, to be staged in the Coliseum during the convention, call for two rings in the arena, each of which will be the scene of high-class hip-podrome and circus acts during the performance. Season tickets for the Shrine Coliseum events, including the \$1,000,000 motion picture electrical pageant, four Circus Maximum performances, and two Oriental parades, cost \$5.50 and are now on sale at the B. H. Byars store, Seventh and Olive streets, Los Angeles and Hollywood boulevard at Vine, Hollywood.

Both Hollywood and Los Angeles will be lavishly decorated for the convention, according to arrangements now being made by the Shrine Downtown Building Decorating committee, which will offer five silver trophies for the best decorated stores and buildings.
