ORDINANCE NO. 188 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 118 OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, BY ADDING SECTION 12C.

The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows: Section 1. Ordinance 118 of the City of Torrance, is hereby amended by adding thereto Section 12C, in the following words:

SECTION 12C It shall be unlawful for any person to park, store, operate, or cause to be parked, stored, or operated, any vehicle, or other personal property, on, along, or over the right-of-way of the Pacific Electric Railway Co., lying between the paved portions of Cabrillo avenue and between Plaza Del Amo and Border avenue, and between the paved portions of Sartori street, between Redondo boulevard and Dominguez street; and between the paved portions of Redondo Blvd. between Post Ave. and a point 420 feet west of Cedar avenue.

It shall be unlawful for any person to propel, or cause to be propelled, any vehicle or other means of travel along Cabrillo Ave., between Plaza Del Amo and Border Ave., or along Sartori St., between Redondo Blvd. and Dominguez St.; or along Redondo Blvd. between Post Ave. and a point 420 feet west of Cedar Ave. except in a direction such that progress along such streets shall be along the right hand side of the Pacific Electric Railway right-of-way which constitutes an unpaved portion lying between the two paved portions of two such streets.

Sec. 2: The City Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published once in the Torrance Herald, thereupon the same shall be in full force and effect. Approved: JOHN DENNIS, Mayor of the City of Torrance.
