Figuroa Work Will Start Soon
Contractor Will Be on Job in 40 Days; Award Bids July 15
GARDENA—Property owners in this district who have been awaiting reports concerning highway in this section will be interested in the progress announcements of Broadway, Figuroa and Vermont from individuals who have been devoting their time to their progress. The right-of-way for Broadway south of 14th street, extending through Athens has been acquired according to information from Mr. Couley of the County Road department. Bids for the work will be posted July 8 and work is expected to begin about September 1. Mr. Couley said there was every assurance that Broadway would be opened south.

Property Up as Result of Suit
INGLEWOOD.—A notable victory was won for Inglewood property values yesterday in Judge Fleming's court when Mr. and Mrs. Claire Spaulding were awarded \$100 more for property condemned by the Los Angeles Gas and Electric corporation than they had originally asked.
The property in question is the lot just north of the site purchased from John Rowley for the office building of the gas company at Commercial street and Manchester avenue. The Spauldings asked \$17,500 for the lot, but the gas company refused to pay this much and instituted condemnation proceedings.
