THAT CAR OF YOURS

Five points that require constant thought and attention about the motor are—ignition, subclication, and the cooling system. A frequent check either by yourself or your mechanic may save time abd expense.

When your engine starts but does not pull, poor carburetion is probably the cause. Hack smoke coining from the exhaust is an indication for this. Another possible cause is 'Aive leaking resulting in pobr compression, or atteking limition politics.

If the brakes squeak the first thing to look for is adjustment or the shoes on the drums. It is also possible that due to lin-ing wear, rivet heads may be dragging, or grit and gravel may be imbedded in the lifting.

The door hings and locks on your car should be inspected at least once every three months. It is surprising how the door hinge screws work loces.
